Instruct undergraduate students interested in Social Work or related studies. Provide advising to students to help them successfully matriculate through a CSWE accredited BSW program. Offer insight into the field of Social Work to students and serve as a resource to practice opportunities for students seeking experiences outside of the classroom. This course incorporates the impact of oppressive behaviors such as racism, sexism, homophobia, affirmative action, xenophobia, and other oppressive structures today. Students are stretched to think outside the box and examine the world's encounters through a multicultural lens. This course has been complemented by students and each semester the enrollment of non-SW majors increases, often via student referrals. HBSE highlights the person-in-environment and examines the biological, psychological, social-structural, and cultural aspects of human development from infancy and childhood to adolescence from a social systems perspective, emphasizing diversity and oppression as well as ethical issues. Students are encouraged to consider themselves and the personal stories of person-in-environment and how circumstances would differ with a shift in the environment.

Expand student views of Social Work practice by instructing a variety of electives. In SW Practice for Healthcare students were linked with highly esteemed practitioners from across the U.S. working in a role related to the students' interest. Students were interviewed social workers and gained a better understanding of the role. Students complimented that this assignment was: meaningful, fun, educational, and solidifying as a career goal. Seminar in Resilience students were forced to explore self-care measures for themselves and develop a wellness plan to help future clients do the same.
